**Open** = Horse's opening odds  
**5M** = Odds at five minutes to post (user input)  
**1M** = Odds at one minute to post (user input)

**Picks:** Ray's picks for the race, expressed as a "handicapping opinion." Opinion structure is as follows: a "slash" (/) represents a clear choice over the next horse/tier, while a dash (-) represents a mild choice. Example opinions:
