Picks: Ray's picks for the race, expressed as a "handicapping opinion." Opinion structure is as follows: a "slash" (/) represents a clear choice over the next horse/tier, while a dash (-) represents a mild choice. Example opinions:																				
1/2-3/4 (#1 wins, #2-3 fight for second, #4 fourth).																				
1-2/3/4 (#1-2 fight to win, #3 third, #4 fourth)																				
1-2-3/4 (#1-2-3 fight to win, #4 fourth)																				
1-2-3-4 (#1-2-3-4 all fight to win)																				
1/2-3-4 (#1 wins, #2-3-4 fight for second)																				
You generally want your wagers to reflect the opinion. If you like 1/2-3-4, that would be reflected by keying #1 over #2-3-4, whereas if the opinion is 1-2-3-4, you might box all four horses (if you want to spend the money). If the opinion is 1/2/3-4, you might box #1-2, play 1-2/3-4, etc. BUY THE BOOK FOR THE FULL STRATEGY!
